

Massage Practitioner Registration Information

Who does this apply to? California Massage Therapy Council (CAMTC)-licensed Massage Therapists/Practitioners who are employees or owner of a Massage Establishment or Off-Premises Massage Business owned by others.

PLEASE NOTE: Separate requirements apply for Massage Establishments and Off-Premises Massage Business Owners (independent contractors) who are also practitioners. You will need both a Massage Establishment or Off-Premises Massage Business Permit and a Massage Practitioner ID card, however, the ID card will not be provided until Business Permit approval is approved.

[Refer to Simi Valley Municipal Code Section 5-15.01 for the rules and regulations governing Massage Establishments. All fees are non-refundable.]

What do I need to register? The City of Simi Valley will provide the CAMTC-licensed therapist employee with an identification card upon registration. No background investigation or finger printing are required for employees. You must provide proof of employment status to the satisfaction of the City. Independent contractors who receive 1099-type tax reporting/income are their business owners. Independent contractors shall complete the registration and submit it with the Off-Premises Massage Business Permit and the ID card will be issued upon approval. Massage Establishment owners who are also practitioners must apply for a Massage Establishment permit and the ID card will be issued upon approval.

- Picture Identification - current state-issued driver's license or Identification card
- Current valid CAMTC Identification Card
- Facial Photos – two (2) 2"x2" taken within four months of application date (each owner)
- Proof of Employment status for verification only – copy of current pay stub, letter of employment, employment contract must be shown to ensure that the registrant is a W-2 style traditional employee or equivalent

When will I receive my permit? Employees will receive their ID card immediately. Business owners will receive it upon approval of the Massage Establishment or Off-Premises Massage Business Permit.

How long is my registration good for? Registration cards are good for two years. Within 60 days of its expiration, please return to Customer Services to update your registration.

Massage Practitioner Registration Information

Common Questions and Answers:

- Q: My employer is located outside of the City of Simi Valley, what massage permit(s) do I need?
- A: An Off-Premises Massage Business Permit and Business Tax Certificate is required for the business owner. Employees (CAMTC-licensed practitioners) must also register with the City.
- Q: Does the City require Live Scan or Background Investigations for employees?
- A: No, not for traditional employees.
- Q: Can I transfer my registration to another person?
- A: No. Massage Permits and Registration Cards of any kind are not transferable.
- Q: I am an Independent Contractor and work at several establishments, what do I need?
- A: Independent Contractors are business owners (1099-type employee), and need to obtain an Off-Premises Massage Business Permit for their work by providing proof of 1099-status and the tax-reported business location. Please refer to the Off-Premises Massage Business Permit for more information. If the business is based from their Simi Valley-located home [although no massage services may be provided at the home] the business owner must also obtain a Home Occupation Permit for office purposes. If the business is commercially based, a Zoning Clearance is also required for the office/dispatch location. Massage Practitioner Registration is also required concurrently.
- Q: I am a CAMTC-licensed practitioner and an employee, do I need a permit?
- A: All practitioners working in Simi Valley must complete a registration form, and will be provided an identification card. Only business owners/independent contractors must obtain Massage Establishment or Off-Premises Massage Business Permits.
